 - The police were contacted to come and watch/observe the first two weeks
 - Note went home via handing it out to people in their cars
 - hindsight there should have been a weeks notice given before implementing it
 - The drop off is not the issue it is just the pickup
 - Teachers and school faculty are not required to cross kids, but we want to keep them safe

- Teachers will stay in their spots to keep all kids safe. Parents will be asked to come get their students physically instead of teachers crossing them across any traffic lanes.
 - This is about safety, not convenience
- We are still trying to create the safest and most efficient pickup
- The city roads crew moved the sign and they reinserted two signs to show where the pedestrian crosswalk should be
- Mrs. Huntsman has ordered signs to help parents know where we are asking parents to pull forward as far as they can before stopping
